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Introduction

Purpose

The goal of this handbook is to support CMSA Member Clubs in preparation for and throughout the registration process, as well as guide parents/caregivers when choosing a program for their youth athlete(s). This handbook includes important information such as the CMSA Program Calendar and League Structure, key messaging, and program goals across CMSA's programming to assist clubs in marketing and communicating the CMSA league offerings to parents and families.

Remember:

- Individual player development is paramount
- The environment created by coaches and parents needs to be a stimulating learning environment focused on development and fun
- CMSA advocates for equal playing time for all players and for them to try all positions

Language and Terminology

Language determines the culture we operate in, and if we want to develop an accessible and inclusive sport culture in Calgary, an emphasis on using appropriate language is key. We all play a role in promoting a consistent message to participants and families about the benefits of each competition model.

CMSA leagues and programming operate in a grassroots-sporting environment and there are no elite players or teams. Elite players are found on youth national teams and full-time professional programs. We currently do not operate in any of those environments or programs. Member Clubs should avoid using words such as elite, premier, select, etc. in communications and program marketing.

Team Entry

Teams are entered at the CMSA Team Entry Deadline. Member Clubs review tiering with CMSA before the group format schedules are produced. There will be an opportunity in December to facilitate team swaps between divisions should teams be misplaced. These details will be provided directly to the Member Clubs.

Standards for Quality Soccer

Canada Soccer's **Standards for Quality Soccer (SQS)** is designed to outline the minimum expectations of member organizations in Canada. It is expected that all member organizations provide a developmentally appropriate, safe, enjoyable, accessible, inclusive, and welcoming playing environment for their participants, which differentiates it from non-member soccer and unorganized play. To be considered as a quality soccer provider, member organizations must also be in good standing with their governing organization(s) and meet the expectations of membership.

Annual Member Affiliation

As outlined in the CMSA Governance Policy and Procedures, all CMSA members, voting and non-voting, must undergo an annual affiliation and audit to confirm their participation in CMSA for the upcoming year and remain a Member Club in Good Standing with CMSA. Member's who do not submit their Annual Audit & Affiliation, on the prescribed forms, prior to August 31st risk their standing with CMSA and/or their membership benefits as outlined in the CMSA Governance Policy and Procedures.

Goals of the Shane Homes Grassroots League

CMSA's Grassroots League, sponsored by Shane Homes, is modelled after national and international best practices and **Calgary Minor Soccer Association League Standards** with a developmentally appropriate playing environment that allows expression, creativity, and development to flourish. Match Day provides players with more time on the field, more time on the ball, and flexible matchups through an open roster system.

This league encourages mixed-ability (balanced) groupings prioritizing social relationships as the basis of Match Day groups. This allows players to move between groups as required to ensure that each participant has a positive and developmentally appropriate match environment. The Shane Homes Grassroots League prioritizes enjoyment, so players want to come back next week and more importantly, for many seasons to come!

CMSA U10 and U11 League

Developmental Plus+ and Developmental

CMSA's U10 and U11 League has a 'Developmental Plus+' and 'Developmental' stream. Both streams offer a quality experience for players and their families. **Neither stream is purely based on ability but on the needs, interests, and motivations of the child.** The determining factors in evaluating whether to place groups in the "Developmental Plus+" or "Developmental" streams are the length of the season and the proximity of their matches. "Developmental Plus+" will play in a city - wide division and have a longer, split format. "Developmental" will have regionalized play with a shorter season. In this player-first model, clubs are encouraged to evaluate players based on their levels of interest and commitment in soccer and utilize social relationships (friendships) as a key factor in forming teams.

CMSA advocates for equal playing time for all players and to try all positions on the pitch. No scores or standings are kept in the Developmental Plus+ or Developmental stream.

Alberta Player Development League

About the Alberta Player Development League

Clubs achieving the National Youth Club License participate in the standards-based Canada Soccer Player Development Program (PDP). The PDP provides an environment (both in training and competition) to allow for high-quality organizations to contribute to the ongoing development of players, coaches, officials, and administrators. The **Alberta Player Development League (APDL)** is the game component of the Player Development Program in Alberta. The APDL is governed and operated by the Alberta Soccer Association.

Format and Key Dates

The APDL games program is built within a year-round calendar with scheduled rest and recovery periods. This calendar encourages a year-long commitment to the Member Club of your choice.
